## FSPA PARTNERS WITH WLSL<sup>TM</sup> TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE ON JUNE $24^{\rm TH}$

(SARASOTA, Fla.) June 16, 2016 – On Friday, June 24th, 2016, tens of thousands of kids and adults at aquatic facilities around the world will unite for the seventh year in a row to make noise that *Swimming Lessons Save Lives*. <sup>™</sup> A global event, The World's Largest Swimming Lesson<sup>™</sup> (WLSL), will take place over the course of 24 hours at an estimated 500 locations in more than 20 countries. The Florida West Coast Chapter of the Florida Swimming Pool Association will be participating in the WLSL at the Palm Harbor YMCA. The event will take place from 10-10:30am.

Since its inception, more than 155,000 children and adults have participated in WLSL lessons generating more than half a billion media impressions about the vital importance of learning to swim. The 2015 WLSL event included 38,170 participants from 22 countries.

Tragically, drowning remains the leading cause of unintended injury related death for children ages 1-4, and the second leading cause of accidental death for children under 14. Research shows participation in formal swimming lessons can reduce the risk of drowning by 88% among children aged 1 to 4, yet many kids do not receive formal swimming or water safety training.
