The FSPA would like to thank Rep. Reagan and Sen. Storms for their resolutions and Gov. Crist for his proclamation declaring April 2008 as Swimming Pool Safety Month. This is a great way to remind everyone of the importance of pool safety.

These resolutions were read on the House and Senate floor in March during our Legislative Days. Printed here is the Senate Resolution. The House Resolution and Governor's Proclamation contain the same information with minor changes to the text.

Senate Resolution

A resolution recognizing April 2008 as "Swimming Pool Safety Month." WHEREAS, the State of Florida has more than one million swimming pools, over 37,000 of which are public facilities regulated by the Department WHEREAS

WHEREAS, swimming pools and spas are recreational facilities of Florida residences, and WHEREAS Florida residences.

WHEREAS, Florida hotels and condominiums have thousands of swimming pools, spas, and wading pools used by even more visitors and WHEREAS, the call.

WHEREAS, the education of building code and health department paramount to ensuring pool safety, and WHEREAS, the Virginia O

WHEREAS, the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool & Spa Safety Act was recently signed into law by the President of the United States, providing concerning residential pools, and overall outreach and education on WHEREAS 2 2000.

WHEREAS, a new national consensus safety standard, ANSI/APSP 7 Suction Entrapment Avoidance, was developed in accordance with the Commission, making the State of Florida a leader in preventing serious injury WHEREAS Chapter 5 1 5

WHEREAS, chapter 515, Florida Statutes, is the Residential Swimming drowning, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Swimming Pool Association and the Florida Department of Health's Office of Injury Prevention are co-hosting the 2008 Swimming Pool and Water Safety Forum to increase safety awareness among WHEREAS, the Florida Swimming Pool Association and the Florida Swimming

WHEREAS, the Florida Swimming Pool Association continues to promote safety messages to consumers and strives to educate the pool industry on through classes, informative brochures, and the new FSPA Safety Program,

WHEREAS, swimming pool and spa injuries and accidents can be prevented through the responsible behavior and preventative actions of white the swimmers, and those responsible for the facilities, and

WHEREAS, mass media communications concerning swimming pool and spa safety during the peak period of use by consumers can create increased NOW THEREFORE BOTH Decolored by the Consumer of safety devices,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida: That the Florida Senate recognizes April 2008 as "Swimming Pool Safety advocating practices of pool safety and providing information to the public.

Let the games begin, the legislature is in!

I mentioned in my article last month the upcoming State Legislative Session and the implications that the regulation has on our industry. I hope you recall our

success from last year's session where we prevailed with the single wire bonding grid fix and the site specific engineering that would significantly have increased the cost of building a pool for your consumers.

I am writing this article 10 days after the session started and there are already several bills proposed that could have significant impact on our industry.

We can start with a positive note and let you know that a Senate bill has been amended with language that will add a pool contractor as a permanent seat on the Florida Building Commission. This is representation on the FBC that was identified in the FSPA strategic plan three years ago; hopefully we will be successful in accomplishing this milestone.

Another suction entrapment bill has been filed that is inconsistent with ANSI/7 standards and the Federal Act. We are working with all parties concerned to address this issue in Tallahassee.

Governor Crist's "Green" energy

initiatives will definitely have some impacts on pumps, motors and heaters. The FSPA Energy Task Force is currently working with manufacturers obtaining pertinent information crucial to our educating legislators of the economic impacts these measures could have short and long term.

There is still the possibility of a reinstatement of the sales tax on pool service. This proposal came out of a commission formed every 20 years to review state revenue sources. We could see some movement on this item as we go through the session.

These are just some of the items on our plate these next two months. We are fortunate to have Jennifer Hatfield, FSPA Director of Government and Public Affairs, and Kari Hebrank, FSPA Lobbyist, in Tallahassee monitoring the daily activities. Your membership dues help provide this valuable service and our return on the investment helps keep all our businesses viable.

Check the FSPA web site regularly as updates on these bills and any additional bills transpire. We will do our best to keep you up to date on everything happening.

The Pool Industry Political Action Committee drive is on and the Chapter contest is in full swing. Please write your check to PIPAC and send it to the office in Sarasota. Along with your dues, this check enables our industry to support the legislators who assist our industry.

The FSPA Safety Conference is in Orlando at the Rosen Centre Hotel on April 10-11. Make plans to attend!

FSPA Legislative Update, March 20, 2008

The third week of Session is about to come to a close. FSPA Legislative Days are being held next week and overall the FSPA legislative agenda is moving in a positive direction! An update on some of the bills follows. Also remember to watch out for our e-newsletter updates on the legislative session, these reports can also be found on our Web site at floridapoolpro.com.

Swimming Pool & Spa Safety SB 1580 by Rich; HB 963 by **Bucher**

SB 1580 and its companion are intended to implement the recentlypassed federal legislation entitled the "Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act" that provides mandatory federal requirements for suction entrapment avoidance and establishes a voluntary grant program for states that meet the minimum requirements of the Act. As originally drafted, section 4 of the bills would require ALL pools to have either a safety vacuum release system, a suction-limiting vent system, a gravity drainage system that uses a collector tank, an automatic pump shut-off system, or a device or system that disables the drain. The FSPA has worked with the bill sponsors to amend section 4 of the bill which is inconsistent with both the federal act and the recently adopted ANSI/APSP-7 Suction Entrapment

Avoidance Standard which becomes effective in Florida on October 1, 2008.

STATUS: SB 1580 was amended in Health Regulations on March 19 and passed 7-0. Now the bill is consistent with the federal act and the ANSI 7 standard. SB 1580 will be heard next in Regulated Industries. HB 963 has yet to be heard.

Florida Building Commission **Appointee** SB 560 by Constantine; HB 697 by Aubuchon

FSPA convinced both bill sponsors that the pool industry is in dire need of representation from a pool contractor on the Florida Building Commission. Among other provisions, both bills seek to add a pool contractor to the Florida Building Commission. Rather than expand the Commission to 24 members, the legislation requires the chair of the Commission to be appointed from amongst the 23 members. Additionally, the bills allow industry and trade associations to recommend candidates to fill their industry-specific Commission seat. FSPA would be able to recommend the pool industry candidate as currently written in the bills.

STATUS: SB 560 was amended in its second committee of reference on Tuesday in Regulated Industries. The bill continues to have the addition of a

pool contractor on the commission. HB 697 was amended in H. Infrastructure on March 13 and also has the pool contractor provision.

Energy SB 1544 by Saunders; PCB ENR-01; etc.

Energy is the "hot topic" for the 2008 Session and there are bills dealing with sustainable and green building, energy efficiency and conservation, appliance standards, net metering, greenhouse gas emissions, telecommuting, renewable energy, biofuel and ethanol production, solar energy, wind energy, thermal efficiency standards, carbon emissions, capture and storage, etc., etc. SB 1544, the governor's proposal, was presented by DEP Secretary Mike Sole and workshopped in S. Environmental Protection on March 6 and discussed again on March 13. The House Energy Committee also released and discussed their version of the bill on March 5 and again on March 12.

FSPA was concerned about a provision in section 25 of SB 1544 and in the House version relating to product approvals that states: "water

heaters for swimming pools such that only such devices that use solar thermal radiation to heat water may be sold or installed in this state." FSPA lobbied lawmakers on why solar pool heaters are not the panacea for energy efficiency with respect to heating swimming pools.

STATUS: SB 1544 was amended and reported out of the S. **Environmental Protection committee** on March 19. The amended version allowed for all types of water heaters for swimming pools, eliminating the solar only requirement. PCB ENR-01 was also heard on March 19. It was amended and reported out of the H. Energy committee, the amended version also allowed for all types of water heaters for swimming pools. An amendment was offered, but withdrawn by Rep. Kriseman, which would have added the appliance standard language contained in HB 1383 by Rep. Randolph. FSPA is concerned about some of the language in HB 1383, specifically, standards for pool heaters, pool pumps, and portable electric spas. We continue to work with Rep. Randolph to find an alternative that is acceptable.

Attention!

Arbitration program changes have been made.

Arbitration, per Board of Directors, will now be handled by the state office. A new sample clause for your contracts will be available soon.

Insurance Update


Is your subcontractor's coverage in force?

Attention all contractors! Just because one of your subcontractors has supplied you with a certificate of insurance three months ago stating that they have workers compensation coverage in force, doesn't mean that by the time they are on your jobsite they still have the coverage. Certificates of Insurance are usually issued when a policy renews or when the policy is first written. What will happen though if by the time that subcontractor is on your jobsite, they haven't paid their premium to the insurance company, lost their coverage and brings their employees onto your jobsite and one of them is injured? According to State Statutes, you the contractor then become liable for the injuries of that injured employee of your subcontractor. You as the main contractor heading up the job are ultimately responsible for anything that happens on the jobsite. Because your subcontractor has lost his/her workers compensation coverage and is therefore unable to have their employees injuries covered, you as the contractor then become responsible for their injuries. Just as scary a scenario is if an inspector from the State Bureau of Workers' Compensation happens to be on your jobsite and finds that one

of your subcontractors is working without their proper insurance. If this happens, the inspector will shut down not only the jobsite he/she's at, but also any other jobsite that subcontractor may be connected to. So, if that subcontractor is working at three of your jobsites, then all three will be shut down.

So how do you help prevent this from happening? Well, you can either require a new certificate of insurance before the start of every job (which is a time consuming proposition) or you can simply go on the internet and check online with the Florida Department of Financial Services Workers Compensation Database. It's a free public database and can be found at www.fldfs.com/WCAPPS/ Compliance_POC/wPages/query. asp. This database is updated daily and will tell you if your subcontractor's workers compensation coverage is in force or not. You can also check to see if they have a valid exemption or not. Using this tool daily can help prevent you from having to pay for unexpected medical bills of uninsured subcontractors or from having to deal with unexpected shutdowns of your jobsites. Blueprint for Successful Networking By: Barry McCoy

Building relationships with other high quality contractors in other trades promotes your services and increases your credibility. Networking partners do not need to be resold again and again, and your network of partners establishes your company as a "professional" throughout your area. By the way, did I mention that the networking process increases your sales and profits!

Key Points:

To establish a smooth running networking process requires a "system."

Preparation and Organization: Which trades do you want to network with? Ask these questions: who will reveal the need for your services, who will create the need for your services, and who will compliment your business. Create a prospect list (Yellow Pages, Chamber, Angie's List, etc.) To manage contacts you will need a "process" and a software program to handle it.

Marketing Tools


- Short business biography of the company
- Unique Service Proposition What makes you different
- Tech pack Develop specific literature for partners to give out

Establishing Relationships

- When are the best times to call potential partners
- Commit to call each day (20-30 min./day, 2-3 contacts/day)
- Steps for creating new partner relationships: 1. Mail short letter and bio, 2. Call three days later to be sure it arrived, 3. Send full second letter describing the proposed partnership relationship,
 4. Call back and request a time to "talk"
- Decide on a Reward program. What reward and how is it earned?

Three simply strategies for building trust with your partner:

- 1. Use phone to contact each other call when a referral is created.
- Always protect your partner's integrity. Take care of their customers.
- 3. Regular follow up and contact (i.e., thank you letter or card)


